The mission of the Bryant-Jordan Student-Athlete Program is to (1) recognize students who, by ability and effort, have achieved excellence in both academics and athletics and (2) motivate and encourage all segments of the student population to strive to be the best they can be.

In each high school in Alabama an administrator may nominate a senior who the administrator believes is both a superior athlete and an outstanding student. The nominee should have played an important role in the interscholastic athletic program of the school, as well as maintaining the highest standards of academic performance. The following factors are considered in the selection process:

1. Scholastic Standing,
2. Athletic Honors,
3. Student Leadership, and
4. Civic/Church Leadership.

The secondary schools in Alabama are divided into six athletic classes based on enrollment. Each class then is divided into eight regions with each region having 8 to 10 schools. In determining the **Bryant-Jordan Outstanding Scholar-Athlete** winners, the following procedures are used:

1. Selected school administrators in each region determine nominees from each school and area and select the regional winners;
2. Regional winners are evaluated by a state committee to determine the winner for each of the six classes; and
3. Class winners are re-evaluated by the state committee to determine the top scholar athlete.

It is the desire of the Alabama Sports Hall of Fame and the Alabama High School Athletic Association that you will nominate a student from your school who you believe is deserving of the recognition that comes from competing for the **Bryant-Jordan Outstanding Scholar-Athlete Award**.

The attached form must be used to nominate your student athlete. A one (1) page typewritten letter should be included to amplify the qualifications of the student beyond the information contained on the nomination form.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING NOMINATING FORM

PART I

In this section fill in the requested information. Be sure to include the student's telephone number. Indicate within which area, region, and class the high school competes in interscholastic athletics.

PART II

In this section indicate the nominee's cumulative grade point average for the following subjects undertaken at the high school level (grades 9-12); English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and Foreign Language. Be sure to indicate the number of Carnegie units upon which the grade point average is based. The student's class standing should indicate both the student's relative position and the number of students in the class. Academic Honors should include whether the student valedictorian, membership in the National Honor Society, National Merit Scholarship Finalist or semi-finalist, or other recognized evidence of scholastic attainment.

PART III

List all interscholastic sports in which the nominee participated. Indicate the number of years played and position (if appropriate). The particular sport played is **NOT** a criterion for selection.

PART IV

In this section indicate all athletic honors bestowed upon the nominee such as All-American, All-State, All-County, All-City, Most Valuable Player, or Team Captain. Be sure to indicate in which sport the student was honored.

PART V

In this section indicate all offices held by the nominee in student government, class offices held, any club offices held, and any other indicators of the nominee's leadership role in the school (e.g., yearbook editor, newspaper editor).

PART VI

Indicate the student's participation in civic and/or church related activities that demonstrate the student's leadership ability and involvement in areas outside of the school. These activities might include teaching Sunday School classes, membership in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Campus Crusade, working with youth in a YMCA or community sponsored recreation program, Scouting, etc.

A narrative/letter should be used to amplify the qualifications of the student and to highlight those activities that were enumerated in Parts II, V, and VI. This item may be completed by someone other than the nominating individual and must be no longer than one (1) typewritten page.

A COPY OF THE STUDENT'S TRANSCRIPT, INCLUDING ALL TEST SCORES (STANFORD, BCT, AND AHSGE) MUST ACCOMPANY THIS NOMINATION. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION MAY BE REQUESTED DURING THE SELECTION PROCESS.
